# TAXES

The State mandate to vote on school budgets establishes May 17, 2022 as the date for the budget vote and school board election. The same legislation influences the following tax collection procedures:

- We now collect taxes starting in September.
- · Like central schools, we use current year assessment rolls
- Since these rolls are not produced until August, we have had to estimate them for the following tables, and final tax rates could vary.

October 1st to October 31st :	2%




#### **ENROLLMENT BY GENDER**

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
